The eggs were found over 2 days in a survey of 66 hedgerows by a party of BCT staff and volunteers supported by National Trust staff and a local resident. A project to manage 'Hedgerows for Hairstreaks' has been in place in the area since 2009 under the direction of the South Downs National Park Authority. This has involved working with local landowners to support the sympathetic management of hedgerows to both encourage good blackthorn growth and prevent the destruction of brown hairstreak eggs through excessive flailing. The 2012 survey used the same methodology as a 2009 survey in the same location that recorded 21 brown hairstreak eggs amongst 73 hedgerows. The 2012 results therefore represent an encouraging trend."

Mike Gibbons writes: "After reading about Peter Hunt's Large Tortoiseshell at Walter's Copse on the Isle of Wight I thought I would venture over there on Friday. It was a very warm and sunny day when I arrived and I soon found 4 Peacocks, 5 Commas, 2 Brimstones and my first Green-veined White. I met Peter whilst walking around and he told me where he had seen his Large Tortoiseshell previously. He left and I hung around the area. At around 13.00 I was about to leave when I accidently put up large orange butterfly which then landed again nearby and began imbibing on the mud. This was indeed a Large Tortoiseshell and hung around the area after a few powerful strong flights above the trees. I last saw it at 14.41 when it flew up high above the trees. I have looked at Peter's photos and believe this was a different individual as it had little if any damage to it's wing edges. It was a big beast (probably a female) and allowed close approach once settled. At last I have seen one on the island after trying over the past few years and what a spectacular butterfly it was! Many thanks for your guidance Peter.

Brian Fellows reports from Warblington (SU727062) where the following observations were made: Large Tortoiseshell (1). "While cycling back from Havant to Emsworth this afternoon, I got off my bike to cross the busy junction of Southleigh Road and Emsworth Road at Green Pond Corner, Warblington. While there, I spotted what struck me at the time to be an extraordinarily large Tortoiseshell butterfly basking in the warm sunshine on the trunk of one of the trees on the green space immediately opposite the One-Stop store - Grid Ref: SU727062. The butterfly on the tree just did not look right for a Small Tortoiseshell, as well as its large size it was much duller all over than a regular Small Tortoiseshell. Could it be a Large Tortoiseshell? I had never seen one of these and did not know what features to look for. So, I took several photos to check at home with the books. I did not see the hindwing. Features of the Warblington butterfly which would appear to support to Large Tortoiseshell ID are: 1. Large size 2. Overall dull upper wings 3. Hardly any sign of blue spots along the outer edge of the upper forewing. However, edges of the wings were ragged which may account for their absence. 4. The absence of a white spot in the corner of the forewing. An alternative ID is of a rather battered and ragged Small Tortoiseshell.".

Seriously though I went to the Duke of Burgundy meeting at Queen Elizabeth Country Park on Saturday in some of the most appalling weather in April Ive ever known, and it would seem there are real attempts now to reverse it fortunes at the 11th hour. The weather and general conditions have favoured it immensely over and it would seem there are real attempts now to reverse it fortunes at the 11th hour. The weather and general conditions have favoured it immensely over the last three to four years, and good things are happening on several fronts, Habitat loss and reversing many sites where its very borderline have had some very good results over the last couple of seasons, especially in Sussex, where it almost became lost in the 1980's, with a turn around of well over a thousand specimens being seen in 2011! In Hampshire its hoped it well colonise Magdellan Hill Down, and is well on the way to colonise St Catherines Hill Down, these small but important colonies come from nearby sites, and are the consequence of the butterfly becoming more 'mobile' in more favourable years. It is also doing well in several woodland sites over the South Downs, where a close study of it in a well known wood revealed several requirements it needs, and a very close comparison with the chalk downland species revealed just how different the two species are despite the chalk downland species originally coming from wooded areas which had become overgrown and coppiccing had ceased. It was a very informative lecture by some of our leading experts on the Duke of Burgundy, and just shows just how much more there is too learn about this delightful butterfly.

This Saturday I will be leading a walk around Butser Hill to see the specie in all its glory (weather permitting) last year it was gloomy and overcast at 1000 when we all met in the car park but by 1200 it was very sunny and warm, so those people who are a bit 50-50 minded about coming then please give me a ring the night before please. I'm hoping for a good one! "

It sat for a moment with beak full of wing and butterfly body, wondering if it was a good idea, before somehow managing to swallow the lot. Back in the 1990's we had a glut of Small Tortoiseshells on our Buddleias one year (those were the days!) A Spotted Flycatcher had tapped into this food source and we found dozens of STS wings discarded under the bush - they ate only the body. Is eating butterflies whole the norm for Robins I wonder and is it common for them to do so or just the canny few. Anyone else had similar experiences? "

Before I had a chance of a photograph a Grizzled Skipper chased off the intruder!The sun then emerged and it got noticably warmer and the Grizzeld skippers emerged in force, I quickly noticed something 'challenging' a bee fly which turned out to be a pristine DoB. this is my earliest sighting at his site."

(see photo) Coomon Lizards and I saw a Grass Snake unfortunaetly it had scuttled into dense grass before anybody had seen it! In the afternoon we a few more willing to brave the elements although the skies were clear and the sun was warm several times we saw the following in Pamber Forest, which was not pretty underfoot in many areas: Speckled Wood (7) Large Skipper (7) White Admiral (2) Brimstone (1) Red Admiral (2) Ringlet (2) Silver-Washed Fritillary (4) Meadow Brown (5) Comma (2) Several Emperor Dragonflies and Azure Dameselles. I got off of the train at Shanklin and walking through the town I noticed this rather large Hawkmoth in a shop window. I picked it up and carried it through the town in my cupped hands 'doing a Johnny Wilkinson all the way' as not to let the wind get to it. I think it was rather grateful as my hands were warm and dark, and I then put it on a fern in Luccombe Chine. I thought it was a Poplar Hawkmoth but looking at the Field Guide to Moths in Great Britain and Ireland I'm not so sure.I thought it would have a better chance of survival in Luccombe Chine than in Shanklin High street! Can anybody ID it please? Today I led a field trip around Bentley Woods, after gathering everybody together in the car-park I was a bit apprehensive of what we may see as the weather was rather cloudy but 'warmish'. We soon found our quarry the Pearl and Small Pearl-Bordered Fritillaries. Several were roosting on Wood Sorrel with their wings folded only a few inches apart which made for some excellent photo oppoprunities. We then saw a pair a male Pearl and male Small-Pearl Bordered Fritillary both on a grass stem squaring up eye to eye which was some very odd behaviour. The sun shone very intermittently but the Fritillaries were flying quite well. I counted (10) Pearl Bordered Fritillaries and (33) Small Pearl-Bordered Fritillaries. The females were out as well, but we never saw any mating. The highlight of the morning was seeing (4) Argent and Sable Moths, which we gave chase when the opportunity arose. Other Butterflies and Moths seen were Speckled Woods (5) Grizzled Skipper (2) Speckled Yellows, Clouded Buff, Silver Line, and Mother Shipton moth's. Brimstones, Red Admiral, and Small White, and the Duke of Burgundy was seen after everybody had left in the afternoon, and was reported to me by phone when I got home. We also visited another site where there were also Pearl and Small Pearl Bordered Fritillaries Small Heaths and Grizzled Skippers, and many Speckled Woods on the Wing. I'd like to thank every body who came and made this visit one of the highlights in all my years of Butterflying.
