## Wednesday 8th January

Andy Barker provides us with some activity to help pass the winter months:
"Currently not good weather for butterflies, but given the number of branches that have been broken off from high in the crown of oak trees, it is a great

opportunity for people to search for Purple Hairstreak eggs. These appear as pin-head size pale grey discs at the base of oak bud clusters. Best to take a handlens or magnifier for confirmation. Attached image is a photo of one I took a few years back using a microscope. Once you get your eye-in they can be found quite easily if the habitat is right. After the great storm of 1987 I had a 50% success rate in oak branches searched around Southampton Common. All such

records are very useful additions to the Branch database.

Can I also suggest that you check the roof underside and upper parts of walls in garages, garden sheds and barns, for hibernating butterflies. No need to do anything except record what you find. Attached is an image taken today of a Peacock hibernating in my garage. It's presumably been there since last August! Records of hibernating butterflies are quite scarce on our database, so it would be good if we could add to this."
