It was another week of high counts with a total of 6,927 butterflies seen overall at a density of 60.30 butterflies/km of transect length. Only 2018 had a higher figure for Week 13 (73.67). The highest count of the year so far was recorded at Blackdown and an impressive sixteen species were seen at Mockbeggar. This is probably the final week that Silver-studded Blue will head the Species Table and we should be seeing more Gatekeepers, Large Skippers (294 on the four Brockenhurst transects this week) & Ringlet soon.

Moth Report: As we move into summer, the <u>Silver Y</u> has been spotted on a number of transects. This migrant is seen most years and can arrive in good numbers so look out for a fast flying, greyish brown moth, similar in size to a Gatekeeper, that will tend to plonk down in vegetation as it lands. A quick search should reveal the moth with a distinctive silver 'Y' shape on the wing. Also keep an eye out for Burnet moths, particularly the <u>Six-spot Burnet</u>, which should be on the wing soon. The other moths you are likely to stir up as you walk your transect are the small, pale 'grass veneers' that will fly a short distance and then disappear as they fold up their wings and settle as a thin streak beneath a blade of grass or fern leaf. Please do not take time trying to identify or photograph these as there are many different species that are very hard, in some cases impossible, to tell apart even with the best picture.
