It was another week of high counts due to the dominance of Gatekeeper which are now around in huge numbers almost everywhere - only not recorded at Ballard Water Meadows and Black Down this week. The total Week 16 count to date stands at 6,930, equating to 59.9 butterflies/km, the highest density so far this year. Overall there were 27 different species with Breamore having 21 different species followed by Mockbeggar with 19. The top counts were 789 at Breamore, followed by 430 at Perrywood Ivy and 359 at Frohawk.



Grayling counts were well up on Week 15 with a total this week of 42 and hopefully numbers will continue to rise for another couple of weeks at least. This will keep an interest in the heathland routes as Silver-studded Blue continues to decline, although Vales More had a count of 63. Two Painted Lady were seen, the first since Week 9. This time last year this species was abundant all over UK.

Moth Report: Day flying moth numbers continued to be low in Week 16. Both <u>Silver Y</u> and <u>Six-spot Burnet</u> were recorded, albeit in small numbers, and these should still be around in the coming week. Two more to keep a look out for are the <u>Jersey Tiger</u> and the <u>Hummingbird Hawk-moth</u> - both very distinctive species that have been spotted in local gardens and could put in an appearance on our transects, if we are fortunate
