There was another fall in overall numbers this week, now down to 4,596 at a density of 44.21 butterflies/km. Gatekeeper accounted for over 50% of the butterflies recorded and was present on all transects, with 182 seen at Roe South and 169 at Frohawk. At last Clouded Yellow have been seen, recorded on Sections 5 & 8 at Breamore. Now that Silver-studded Blue have all but disappeared, Grayling (42 at Broomy Plain this week) and the multi-voltine (brooded) Small Heath should still provide interest on heathland routes.

Moth Report: It was another quiet week for day flying moths, although there are an interesting range of species around. Keep a look out for <u>Silver Y</u> and <u>Six-spot Burnet</u>. Tiny 'mint moths' may also be spotted. Please look carefully as there are two different species that can be seen - the <u>Small Purple and Gold</u> and the <u>Common Purple and Gold</u> which has an additional gold blob on the trailing edge of the forewing. At the other end of the scale the <u>Bordered Grey</u>, similar in size to a Meadow Brown, may be seen on heathland over the next week or two.
