With the weather as it was, we didn't expect to get so many results for this last week. Thank you all, especially those who went out more than once. While not unexpected, there was another drop in numbers with a total count for all walked transects of 1,485, a density of 12.27 butterflies/km, the lowest for Week 20 since 2014 (7.60). There are still plenty of Grayling around on the heathland transects and a Purple Hairstreak was seen at Warren Farm. Although species diversity is now falling, double figures were still achieved at Mockbeggar, Blashord South and Pimlico Fields. There was a clear distinction between counts of the top five species, with totals well over 100, and the sixth placed Large White with a count of 71.

Moth Report: The warm weather in Week 20 saw an influx of <u>Silver Y</u> moths which were seen on a number of transects. Please continue to look out for these regular migrants in coming weeks. The other of our regular day flying moth migrants, the delightful <u>Humming-bird Hawk-moth</u>, was not seen on transect but has been spotted in local gardens so is also



around. At this time of year a number of distinctive moth caterpillars may also be spotted. This week an <u>Elephant Hawk caterpillar</u> was seen on transect, with a <u>Buff Tip</u> moth caterpillar recorded the week before. Records of caterpillars are very welcome but please make clear on the recording sheet that it is the larval and not adult form that has been seen to avoid confusion. Also remember never to touch hairy caterpillars with bare hands as many of the hairs can be irritants.
