Silver-Studded Blues

- It's a red data list species
- Needs its heather food plants
- Needs its ant partner
- Has a very short life as a butterfly
- Very sedentary
- On the wing in (May)/June/July

Silver-Studded Blues in East Hampshire/West Sussex

- SSBs are doing well in East Hants/West Sussex on a small number of sites
 - They are present in low numbers on a few other sites
- Transects are walked on four of these
 - All other sites are visited during the flight season
- Transect data is used to focus conservation effort on key butterfly areas
 - SSBs are very sedentary and short lived
 - Will move to adjacent areas if habitat suitable

- This is a big site with a wide variety of habitat
 - Up to thirty butterfly species recorded each year
- The SSBs are present in a main colony area and in a number of satellite colonies across the site
- Main colony is in an area of wildflower rich heathland
